Subject: Updating Georgia Basic Peace Officer Training Mandate

Today, the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council (GA POST) voted to update and increase the minimum training required in order to become a certified as a Basic Law Enforcement Officer in Georgia in any police academy in Georgia.

The previous minimum standard of training in Georgia consisted of a designated 408 hours. Today, the GA POST Council voted to increase that minimum training up to 810 hours and to add topics that were previously not a part of the Basic Law Enforcement Officer training including Active Shooter Response, Crisis Intervention, Tactical Casualty Control, Officer Resiliency, Extremist Groups, Election Security, Advanced DUI Enforcement, and others.

In addition, training that had previously been provided has been updated and in some cases increased in scope and depth including training in firearms, emergency vehicle operations, defensive tactics, and physical training.

This update will be effective on January 1, 2025, and marks the culmination of a cooperative effort involving GA POST, The Georgia Sheriffs Association, The Georgia Chiefs of Police Association, The Georgia Public Safety Training Center, and numerous individual agencies and officers who provided subject matter expertise.

Attached to this release is the previous 408 hours of Basic Mandate Training, and the new 802 hours of Basic Mandate Training.
